CALL TO ORDER

- Mayor Christensen called the February 26, 2018 Regular Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Christensen announced that a Quorum was present.

Commissioner Mizell made a motion to approve the January 22, 2018 Regular Meeting minutes, January 2018 Transactions, February 2018 unpaid bills, and account balance reports; Commissioner Wilson seconded the motion; all in favor; motion carried.

Matt Summers with Georgetown-Scott Planning & Zoning discussed the 2017 Comprehensive Plan. Commissioner Strother made a motion to accept the 2017 Comprehensive Plan; Commissioner Mizell seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes. Mayor Christensen announced the plan has been adopted and a resolution will be read next month.

Kelli Humphrey and Gus Thomas with Kentucky Utilities discussed renewing the franchise agreement. Attorney Kearney performed a 1st Reading of Ordinance 2018-02, an ordinance creating a franchise. Commissioner Mizell made a motion to accept Ordinance 2018-02 as read; Commissioner Strother seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.

Attorney Kearney reported that she is working on the paperwork for the annexation area between old 32 and new 32.

Mayor Christensen discussed the Main Street Clean Sweep project. He would like to do that project from April 14 to April 22. He proposed doing a proclamation that invites residents and informs them about the dates and activities. Mayor Christensen made a motion that we adopt April 14 – April 22 as Clean Sweep Week and that we draft a letter encouraging participation by residents and businesses; Commissioner Reese seconded the motion; all in favor; motion carries. Clerk Whelan to call Rumpke to set dumpster on Main Street.

- Mayor Christensen announced there is a citizen interested in purchasing a city lot. The Commission seems interested in selling city lots that aren't included in future plans. Clerk Whelan to research process.

- Commissioner Reese reported that he hasn't found a good reliable car for police yet and he has a quote of \$1700.00 to repair transmission for cruiser repair on one vehicle. Commissioner Reese made a motion to spend up to \$2,000.00 for cruiser repair; Mayor Christensen seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken: Mayor Christensen – yes; Commissioner Reese – yes; Commissioner Strother – no; Commissioner Mizell – no; Commissioner Wilson – yes; motion passes.

- Commissioner Mizell reported that he has ordered a camera system for the park that has 10 cameras. One camera for full weather will be ordered soon. He also stated that the ground is too saturated to put in the new storage shed. He will have this done as soon as possible. Commissioner Mizell said he will be placing an ad in paper for mowing bids.

- Commissioner Strother announced she may be looking at other contractors for the Pike St. wall project. She said they are going to do some work and get two more estimates.

- Attorney Kearney performed a 1st Reading of Ordinance 2018-01, an ordinance enacting and adopting a supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Sadieville. Commissioner Mizell made a motion to approve Ordinance 2018-01 as read; Commissioner Wilson seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.

- Commissioner Reese said there is a meeting on Monday, March 5 for the Police Safety Initiative Committee. For the Police Chief's report; he indicated he has taken care of a few instances, but it has been fairly quiet.

- Commissioner Strother reported that she has requested trash pickup from the interchange into Sadieville. She also picked up the new historic signs that the county provided.

- Commissioner Reese made a motion to adjourn; Commissioner Wilson seconded the motion. The Regular Meeting adjourned at 7:07 p.m.
