

**City of Sadieville**  
Regular Meeting Minutes  
March 26, 2018

CALL TO ORDER

- Mayor Christensen called the March 26, 2018 Regular Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Christensen announced that a Quorum was present.

Commissioner Reese made a motion to approve the February 26, 2018 Regular Meeting minutes, March 5, 2018 Special Meeting minutes, March 19 Special Meeting minutes, February 2018 Transactions, March 2018 unpaid bills, and account balance reports; Commissioner Wilson seconded the motion; all in favor; motion carried.

Mayor Christensen performed a 2nd reading of Ordinance 2018-02, an ordinance creating a franchise. Commissioner Reese made a motion to accept Ordinance 2018-02 as read; Commissioner Wilson seconded the motion; Roll call vote, Mayor Christensen – yes; Commissioner Strother - yes; Commission Wilson – yes; Commissioner Mizell – yes; Commissioner Reese – yes. Motion passes; Ordinance is adopted.

A question was asked about the foreclosure of properties. Attorney Kelli Kearney to follow up.

Commissioner Reese reported that when working on the transmission of the police car, a problem was found with block on engine. He said the cost will be approximately an additional \$1600.00. Commissioner Reese made a motion to approve an additional \$1600.00 for car repairs; Mayor Christensen seconded the motion. There were 4 in favor and Commissioner Mizell said “no”; motion passes. The City of Georgetown will have a surplus vehicle – Year 2010 with approximately 70,000 miles on it. Mayor Christensen said we should check into it; it may buy us time, but not a permanent fix.

Commissioner Mizell also stated that the ground is too saturated to put in the new storage shed. He will have this done as soon as possible.

- Commissioner Mizell reported that the restrooms at park are almost complete. He has also ordered a camera system for the park that has 10 cameras. One camera for full weather should be ordered soon. The system holds 16 cameras. There will be a need for 4 signs that say “Under Surveillance”.
- Commissioner Strother said that she has some rough estimates for the Pike Street Wall, with one more contact to check with. Mayor Christensen advised that we need formal estimates before making a decision.
- Commissioner Strother said she would like to contact owners of properties before paving Eagle Bend. She checked with Planning and Zoning and the Building Inspector, but they have not received anything for those properties. Commissioner Strother is also checking on a drainage problem on Edgewater.
- Mayor Christensen performed a 2<sup>nd</sup> reading of Ordinance 2018-03. Commissioner Strother made a motion to accept as read; Commissioner Wilson seconded; Roll Call Vote – Mayor Christensen- yes; Commissioner Strother – yes; Commissioner Wilson – yes; Commissioner Reese- yes; Commissioner Mizell – no. Motion passes; Ordinance is adopted.
- Mayor Christensen discussed the proposed letter to the residents of Sadieville regarding Clean-Up Week. Commissioner Reese made a motion to send the letter to residents; Commissioner Wilson seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
- Commissioner Mizell voiced concern about Code Enforcement follow-up. Mayor Christensen said we may need something more formal from Code Enforcement, possibly a report.
- Commissioner Mizell made a motion to put up signs at park that states “No Overnight Parking”. Mayor Christensen seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
- Commissioner Strother said the grate at Angle Avenue has fallen again; it should have lifetime guarantee. She will follow up on this.
- For the Police Chief’s report; Commissioner Reese indicated he has taken care of a few instances, but it has been pretty quiet.
- The Public Safety Department Initiative Committee gave a recommendation of Bobby Bruner for Police Chief. Commissioner Reese made a motion to hire Bobby Bruner; Commissioner Strother seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
- Mayor Christensen read a letter of resignation by our City Attorney, Kelli Kearney. Her last day will be April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2018. Mayor Christensen said she provided a recommendation. Commissioner Wilson made a motion to accept the resignation of City Attorney Kelli Kearney; Commissioner Reese

seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.

- Commissioner Reese made a motion to adjourn; Commissioner Wilson seconded the motion. The Regular Meeting adjourned at 7:05 p.m.
