- Mayor Wagoner called the December 28, 2020 Regular Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.
- Mayor Wagoner invited everyone to participate in a moment of silence.
- City Clerk Centers conducted the roll call.

- Mayor Wagoner determined a quorum was present.
- Commissioner Stamper made a motion to approve the meeting minutes for regular meeting November 23, 2020 and special meeting for December 16, 2020; Commissioner Reese seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
- Commissioner Stamper made a motion to approve the meeting minutes from special meeting December 16, 2020; Commissioner Stanley seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
- Commissioner Stamper made a motion to accept the financial reports as written; Commissioner Reese seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
- Mayor Wagoner brought up the annexation and zone change of 151 Vine Street; zone change is from A-1 to R-18 to R-2; Commissioner Stamper made a motion to accept the annexation of approximately 2 acres outside of city limits at 151 Vine St; Commissioner Reese seconded the motion; roll call vote; motion passes.

- Attorney Obermeyer wrote up a sample ordinance for firearm discharge within the city. Fines and misdemeanor charges will need to be thought about first. Commissioner Reese brought up the fact

that the reason we do not have one in place is because of protection of farmers for hunting who own acreage within the city limits. This will be an issue that needs to be researched further. Chief Bruner and Attorney Obermeyer will continue research and it will be revisited at the January meeting.

- Chief Bruner brought up the opportunity with Stryker regarding defibrillators. These are the same units that Georgetown-Scott County EMS use. The equipment total including the service contract is \$9620.00, which includes one old Lifepak 500 trade in value, three new Lifepak 1000 units, three infant/child electrode kits and three 4 year preventive maintenance contracts with 0% interest. We would pay for one unit in 2020, the second unit in 2021 and the third unit in 2022. This deal is with no interest. We must have the signed paperwork turned in by December 31, 2020 to take advantage of this deal. The idea is to have one at City Hall, one at Veteran's Park and one with the on-call police officer. Commissioner Stamper stated her support of this. Commissioner Stanley thinks it is an excellent idea and fantastic investment.
- Commissioner Reese made a motion to enter the contract with Stryker on the Lifepaks: Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; roll call vote; motion passes.

- Commissioner Reese asked if the City would write a letter to allow him to keep his cell phone number that is attached to the Firstnet phone through the City. The City will cancel that phone number on January 1, 2021. Commissioner Reese purchased the phone himself. The Mayor nor commissioners disagree with this.
- Commissioner Cannon joined the meeting via Zoom at 6:24pm.
- Commissioner Cannon does not have any updates for building and maintenance.
- Commissioner Stamper gave the update for the parks and recreation department. She is still working with the Bluegrass Area Development on obtaining 2 separate grants for the proposed splash pad at Veteran's Park. Commissioner Stanley asked about the parking expansion and Mayor Wagoner said it is included in the grant.
- Mayor Wagoner stated that Seasons Lawncare did a fantastic job on the streets last week and weekend with the snow and ice.
- Commissioner Stanley gave the streets, roads, and trails update. The salt shed does not have electricity and poses a safety risk for our snow removal company when they come to load salt. He will work on estimates for running electricity and an outlet then bring it back in front of the commission.
- City Clerk Centers gave an update. The City currently has 178 internet hotspots out and is running smoothly. She asked for \$175 to join the International Institute of Municipal Clerks as she must be a member and participate to gain her certification as a clerk. She requested all commissioners return currently held keys.




- Mayor Wagoner made a motion to approve \$175 for City Clerk to join IIMC; Commissioner Reese seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
- Chief Bruner stated a complaint was issued by Eagle Creek Baptist about the dog messes in Warren Pavilion Park and he stated the police department will start cracking down on that issue. Eagle Creek Baptist also issued a complaint of congested parking in front of the church on Sunday mornings. They are not concerned right at this moment as church is not being held but will begin again soon. The distant parking makes it difficult on elderly parishioners. Chief Bruner suggested maybe getting some signs to put up no parking during Sunday mornings. He explained from the hours of 7am to 1pm on Sunday. Commissioner Stanley will get the signs and posts coming.
- Mayor Wagoner stated that he is very proud of our police force as they have been running radar and pulling motorists over that are exceeding the speed limits. He appreciates the effort they are putting in. Chief Bruner explained that the speeding is becoming an issue and they are trying to make a statement and cut down on the speeding before the weather warms up and children are outside more. He stated there are plenty of speed limits signs posted and there is no excuse.
- City Attorney Obermeyer sworn in Victor Stanley via Zoom.
- City Attorney Obermeyer sworn in April Cannon via Zoom.
- City Attorney Obermeyer sworn in Debra Stamper and Jennifer Halsey, he via Zoom while they attended in person at City Hall.
- Commissioner Cannon stated that she vacated her position on December 7th via email for the upcoming term and asked what she needed to do since the email is not acceptable due to being an electronic signature. Mayor Wagoner stated that she can send a written letter.
- Commissioner Stanley made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 6:51pm; Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
