☐ CALL TO ORDER

- Mayor Wagoner called the January 22, 2024, regular meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.
- City Clerk Centers conducted the roll call.

- Mayor Wagoner determined a quorum was present.
- **Mayor:** Mayor Wagoner read the resignation letter from Commissioner Joshua Cornett. Commissioner Freeman made a motion to accept the resignation; Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- **Mayor:** Mayor Wagoner read the resignation letter of Samantha White from the Sadieville Ethics Board. Commissioner Freeman made a motion to accept the resignation; Commissioner Halsey seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- Commissioner Stamper made a motion to approve Samantha White to replace Commissioner Joshua Cornett; Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed. Attorney Obermeyer swore in Commissioner White.
- **Mayor:** He stated that Wood Line has done an amazing job on keeping the streets clean during the inclement weather, he has received nothing but praise from the community. He stated that the best way to kill a community is to tear it down. If you can't build your community up, and you are that unhappy, then you are not needed in the community. Before you speak about a situation you need to know what you are talking about.
- **Mayor:** Spectrum should be sending out flyers soon to be able to sign up for service. His understanding is that everyone should have service within the next 30 days.
- **Mayor:** DG Foodmart on Porter Road is getting ready to start building, they are waiting for the weather to break.
- **Mayor:** There is an issue with parking on Main Street in front of the church. The fire hydrant cannot be blocked. It requires parking on one side of the street only. His recommendation is to get

removal company. In a typical event, there is a pretreatment before the weather event, and this is based totally on the weather conditions. If it is raining, pretreatment is useless because it gets washed away. Once the event occurs, the salting begins. As the event accumulates, based on the effectiveness of the pretreatment and salt, you may need to go back and do another coat of salt or scraping. He told the snow removal company to spare no expense on the salt because the safety of our constituents is the most important. There are multiple hills within the community that do require extra salting. The communication between himself and the snow removal company is constant before and during an event.



- **City Clerk Report:** Commissioner Stamper made a motion to approve up to \$9800 for Sammy K. Lee to perform the 2023 city audit; Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- **City Clerk Report:** The only regular city meeting this year that will need to be changed to another day is the May meeting, as the fourth Monday falls on Memorial Day. The commission decided to hold a special meeting on May 20 for that month.
- Commissioner Stamper made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 8:23 pm; Commissioner Halsey seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
