Regular Meeting Minutes Monday, April 25, 2022 City Hall @ 6:00pm

CALL TO ORDER

- Mayor Wagoner called the April 25, 2022, Regular Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.
- Mayor Wagoner invited everyone to participate in a moment of silence.
- City Clerk Centers conducted the roll call.

· Mayor Wagoner determined a quorum was present.

City Clerk Laura Centers:

 Citizen Comments: Sam Porter, candidate for Scott County Attorney, made a small presentation introducing himself.

Present

- Citizen Comments: A Vine Street resident asked when the drainage problem on Vine Street will
 be taken care of. Commissioner Stanley stated that the contractor has started to procure
 equipment and should be able to start on the project soon. He said he will try to get her a start
 date.
- Commissioner Stamper made a motion to approve the minutes for the March 28, 2022, regular meeting; Commissioner Epperson Stanley seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- Commissioner Stamper made a motion to accept the financial reports with the addition of the unpaid bills for Attorney Obermeyer for \$487.50, AT&T for \$637.59 and Kentucky American Water for \$35.56; Commissioner Stanley seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- · City Attorney: Nothing to report currently.
- Mayor: The City of Georgetown has informed the City of Sadieville that we can no longer have any additions to the sewer. He is currently pursuing other options.
- Public Safety: Chief Bruner is still waiting on estimate for decals for utility trailer.
- Public Safety: Chief Bruner asked Officer Lawson to bring up the issue of people bringing their
 dogs on the playground area. We need some signs to post and maybe a dog waste station.
 Commissioner Halsey suggested an area for a dog park.
- · Public Works: She does not have anything to report at this time.

- Public Works: Mayor Wagoner asked if we could look at the opportunity to enclose the pavilion
 area at the park to turn into a community center. Commissioner Epperson Stanley and
 Commissioner Stamper will research this.
- Public Works: The maintenance man has been researching hot water heaters for city hall. He has located 2 units that would work for the space. He would prefer the 19 gallon unit for \$356 at Lowe's. There would need to be electric work done to make it work. Commissioner Stamper made a motion to approve \$400 for a hot water heater and supplies for City Hall; Commissioner Halsey seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- Parks & Recreation: Mayor Wagoner made a motion to approve \$400 for city landscaping supplies such as flowers; Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- Parks & Recreation: Commissioner Stamper made a motion to approve \$10,000 for the annual festival planning; Commissioner Halsey seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- Parks & Recreation: Mayor Wagoner stated he has spoken to Commissioner Stanley about
 providing fireworks for the Fourth of July event. He asked Attorney Obermeyer to check on
 insurance regarding the firework display.
- Streets, Trails and Walkways: Seasons Lawncare has completed 3 of the 4 items completed that were approved at the last meeting. The last project is the Vine St drainage project.
- City Clerk: The clerk has received a \$500 Kitty Johnson scholarship to attend the Kentucky Municipal Clerk Institute in July.
- City Clerk: AT&T will be at city hall tomorrow to update the internet. It will be faster and \$200 cheaper than current internet. The police department is having internet difficulties, as they have the old copper wire for the internet. VC3 has been contacted to complete the printer installation at the police department and repair the slow printing issue.
- City Clerk: The annual renewal for termite service at city hall and Rosenwald school is due.
 Mayor Wagoner made a motion to continue with Gateway Pest Control for \$1200/year per location; Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- City Clerk: The city has 2 unclaimed cash accounts on the Kentucky Treasury website. The
 commission agreed to claim these accounts.
- Mayor: We have received a grant for approximately \$47,000 to proceed with a splash pad.
 Planning will begin on this soon.

 Mayor Wagoner made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:15 p.m.; Commissioner Epperson Stanley seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
