- Mayor Wagoner called the September 2, 2021, Special Meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.
- Mayor Wagoner invited everyone to participate in a moment of silence.
- City Clerk Centers conducted the roll call.

- Mayor Wagoner determined a quorum was present.
- Scott County Code Enforcement gave an update on the condition of the Sadieville School building. Mayor Wagoner made a motion to proceed with trying to foreclose on the single lot (apart from the school building) and securing the Sadieville School to Code Enforcement specifications; Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
- 856 Pike Street was sold at auction for \$6900 plus 10% buyers premium and will close on or before 9/27/2021 per Attorney Obermeyer.
- Commissioner Halsey made a motion to purchase a blower for \$150.99 from Rural King and a gas can; Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
- Commissioner Stanley gave an update on the Celebrate Sadieville festival. The committee is currently coming in under budget. The Mayor requested that our maintenance team plan to work September 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>.
- Clerk Centers and Commissioner Epperson-Stanley brought to the attention of the commissioner that the water bill for the police department has been steadily increasing by approximately \$30 per month. It needs to be watched to determine if it is a water leak or just an increase in traffic.
- Commissioner Epperson-Stanley stated that the propane tank at City Hall has been moved closer to the street but steps are still needed leading to it.
- Commissioner Halsey stated that Brandon came in to check the clerk's and chief's computer issues. Brandon told her that it is exceeding his expertise. She suggested hiring a separate IT person. Clerk Centers gave a cost scenario from a company that is backed by KLC. Commissioner Stamper made a motion to approve a one time \$1000 start up cost for computer updates; Commissioner Halsey seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
- Mayor Wagoner made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 11:41 a.m.; Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
