Regular Meeting Minutes Monday, September 26, 2022 City Hall @ 6:00pm

CALL TO ORDER

- Mayor Wagoner called the September 26, 2022, Regular Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.
- Mayor Wagoner invited everyone to participate in a moment of silence.
- · City Clerk Centers conducted the roll call.

- · Mayor Wagoner determined a quorum was present and asked all citizens to sign in.
- Commissioner Stamper made a motion to approve the minutes for the August 22, 2022, regular meeting; Commissioner Epperson-Stanley seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- Commissioner Stamper made a motion to approve the financial reports with the addition of \$370.50 for Attorney Obermeyer, \$4 for Wex, and \$474.00 for Bypass Rentals; Commissioner Stanley seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- · Festival was discussed.
- City Attorney: Brownfield Assessment is still in process for Sadieville school. The plan is for the
 school to be transferred to the city in time for the grant, and then it would be free and clear. The
 vacant lot would then be sold to pay off any outstanding liens on the property.
- Public Safety: Mayor Wagoner made a motion to approve up to \$150 to purchase front floor mats
 for the police Tahoe; Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- Public Safety: Commissioner Halsey made a motion to approve up to \$500 to purchase pepper spray canisters and taser cartridges for the police department; Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- Public Safety: Commissioner Halsey has been approached by citizens asking about clean up along
 the railroad banks. That is the property of the railroad, and the city would need permission to do
 anything.
- **Parks & Recreation:** Commissioner Stamper presented an option of putting a pop machine at the park for the patrons. This issue was tabled until further discussion and research can take place.

 Parks & Recreation: Mayor Wagoner made a motion to approve \$1200 for the purchase of commercial grade outdoor Christmas lights; Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.

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- Parks & Recreation: Commissioner Stamper made a motion to set trick-or-treat for October 31, 2022, from 6pm-8pm; Commissioner Epperson-Stanley seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- Parks & Recreation: Commissioner Stamper made a motion to approve \$800 for the Halloween event budget; Commissioner Epperson-Stanley seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- Public Works: Commissioner Epperson-Stanley has been working with Kentucky Utilities
 regarding power outlets on the power poles on Main Street. Mayor Wagoner suggested she check
 with the Renaissance Program regarding grants for lighting.
- Public Works: Commissioner Epperson-Stanley has received a bid for demolition of 615 Pike Street for \$17,000 that includes demolition, hauling, backfill and sidewalk repairs. Everyone agreed that it needs to be done soon.
- · Public Works: The trashed end of Johnson Alley at Main Street was discussed.
- Streets, Trails and Walkways: Commissioner Stanley requested property descriptions from Attorney Obermeyer on the properties off Davis Lane. There was a discussion of the Vine Street project.
- City Clerk Report: The check for \$500 from the Kentucky Municipal Clerks Institute scholarship
 for training for the clerk has been received.
- City Clerk Report: Mayor Wagoner made a motion to approve \$570 to purchase blank checks for the city bank account; Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- City Clerk Report: Mayor Wagoner made a motion to approve the last payment of \$205.72 to the Kentucky Public Pensions Authority for Brandon Blair; Commissioner Halsey seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- City Clerk Report: The city's designation of a Certified City of Ethics through Kentucky League of Cities has expired and so have the term limits for each member.
- City Clerk Report: PNC credit cards are no longer being used. Clerk Centers asked everyone to
 look at the other card options that are in the binders to revisit at the next meeting.
- City Clerk Report: Kentucky League of Cities Liability Grant programs are open now.
- City Clerk Report: Mayor Wagoner made a motion to increase the monthly insurance benefit for the city clerk from \$250 to \$492 insurance; Commissioner Halsey seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passed.
- Commissioner Stanley made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:40 p.m.; Commissioner Stamper seconded the motion; all in favor; motion passes.
